FROM THE TREASURER

As we enter September, we come to the final two months that the Club is open. So far this season the House operation has been busy so thank you to everyone who supports the Club, brings guests, host parties, and to those who help volunteering to organize and run all the events we have. The Club also relies on timely payments of your House accounts to keep ahead of our liquor and food bills. The majority of members are very good with timely payment, but some are not. So please remember to pay your invoice when you receive it.

The Club is a Not-For-Profit private operation. The House operation (restaurant/bar) operate solely on the net revenue after expenses of food and beverage, sales tax and labor fees. There is no financial support from the General fund (dues) other then it pays all the utility, insurances, and repair bills a typical restaurant would have to cover. Our menus are priced to offer good food/beverage value to our membership and in the same, leave us a little profit at the end of the day. It also offers you a place to come and enjoy dinner/drinks safely and be with friends. Our end of year House profit in 2024 was \$246 and in 2023 was \$2621.

Some members have asked to be able to pay their House accounts via credit card at the end of each month. Beginning this month we have set this up to do but it carries an added fee to their invoices. There are several reasons members find credit card payment a benefit, but the member benefit/convenience will come at a cost to the House operation. The credit card processing fee is 2.99%. Over the course of a typical season, if all member house accounts were paid by credit card, this could come to roughly a \$3800-\$4800 House expense if not collected from the members. Now, that is a worst case but obviously that would negate any small profit made.

Some members don't have the option of payment from their financial institution (credit unions) but many of you do. Online payment by check from your bank is still the easiest way to pay and they mail the check to the Club. Yes, you do not get reward points but then we do not get billed for that convenience either. We are not a big operation, and we do not employ back-office staff.
